# TIM O'BRIEN

Tim O'Brien joined the O'Brien Construction team in 1974, working beside his father, Ed O'Brien, who founded the company in 1962. He attended Michigan State University and graduated from Lawrence Tech before heading to work in the oil fields of Texas and New Mexico as a field engineer. He returned to OCC and worked as a superintendent, estimator, project engineer, project manager, vice president and president. He is registered in the State of Michigan as a professional engineer and as a licensed builder. Tim has also served on numerous nonprofit boards and committees with a concentration on the youth in Detroit.

Tim is currently principal at O'Brien Construction, which is celebrating its 60th year in business, and is working to enhance the quality of our communities through its expertise as team builders and constructors. # FR. BRENDAN McCARRICK

## HOMILIST

*Two roads diverged in a yellow wood, and sorry I could not travel both and be one traveler.*

*-Robert Frost*

Fr. Brendan grew up in County Sligo, on a small farm in the Northwest of Ireland. He was truly blessed to grow up in a large family as the third eldest of eight children. His father worked as a dairy farmer and his mother as a homemaker. His primary and secondary school education took place in the local Catholic Parish Schools.

On a cold day in February 1993, he first encountered the words of Robert Frost... words, he says, "which have remained with me, and words which I have returned to on many occasions as I have forged my way through life." The poem goes: "I shall be telling this with a sigh somewhere ages and ages hence: Two roads diverged in a wood, and I—I took the one less traveled by, and that has made all the difference."

It was at that time that he contemplated where his life would lead, and which road he would take. He asked himself, "Would it be married life or priesthood? Would I be an engineer or a priest? Where would God lead me in life, and am I willing to put my trust in God to lead me?"

The time came to apply to college, and nowhere on the application was "priesthood" an option; so he decided to go to college and study engineering. Although he succeeded in engineering, he was not satisfied, or happy, and he returned to Robert Frost's words and once again to contemplate his vocation in life. It was then that he applied to religious life at age 20.

For three years he struggled with his studies, and was of the view, "if God wanted me to do this it shouldn't be so hard." He recalls, "I knew I was in the wrong place; I was lonely and alone in a seminary, in a class of over 20, and over 170 men studying for Diocesan Priesthood. Feeling so alone opened my eyes. In my heart I knew God truly wants all people to be happy, and fulfilled so I decided to leave and travelled the main road of society. I got a great job in an engineering company, and for almost ten years was extremely successful. I succeeded in purchasing a house, a new car and enjoying the pleasures and pains of life."

A life changing event happened in 2008. Fr. Brendan travelled to Australia to the World Youth Day, where his faith was reinvigorated. It was there he discerned that God was still calling him to priesthood, the only decision was, where? He prayed the words of Mary, the Mother of God, "Be it done unto me according to your word." As he prayed these words, he realized the necessity to "truly listen to God, to listen with my heart and then surrender my will to God, as Jesus proclaimed in the Garden of Gethsemane, 'Not my will, but your will be done.'"

He contacted the vocations director of the Pallottines, and was invited to a weekend retreat. There he learned more about the Pallottines and St. Vincent Pallotti, the founder of the Society, and about himself and where God was guiding him.

On August 11, 2009, while in Medjugorje on his annual retreat, he received a life-changing phone call from the Pallottines. He recalls, "They were congratulating me...that my application to become a member of the Society of Apostolic life had been accepted. Three years later I took my first promises to the Society, 'to give, offer and surrender my whole life to God', and this I do each day by trusting in God, surrendering to his will. Each day I know that God is guiding and directing me." On July 24, 2016, he was ordained in the parish where he was baptized. Soon after he came to Michigan to work at St. Vincent Pallotti Parish and Henry Ford Hospital.

Fr. Brendan says, "I am truly blessed to enjoy my daily parish and hospital ministries in addition to being warmly welcomed by the bishops and priests of the Archdiocese. In addition to the welcome by the clergy of Detroit, it has been a wonderful honor to be welcomed by the many members of the Irish diaspora community located in Southeast Michigan, who are stalwarts in their faith and cultural traditions. May God bless and protect each of you as we celebrate the faith of our fathers and St. Patrick."

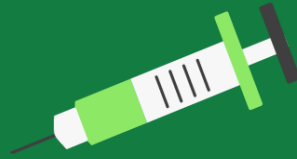
