GREETINGS FROM CORKTOWN

Dear Friends,

Welcome to the spiritual home of the Detroit area Irish Community!

When it was established in 1834, Most Holy Trinity Parish was the first church founded to serve the Irish community in the Midwest United States. Our current church building (1855) is only the second one in our parish history. The current rectory was built in 1887.

St. Patrick's Church in Detroit (1862) was also founded to serve the Irish community. The parish closed in 2015 and the church was sold and demolished this year. We are now working with the Dicastery (department) of Worship and the Sacraments at the Vatican to declare St. Patrick as the official patron of our parish. The name of our parish will not change, but this new designation will allow St. Patrick's Day to be celebrated as a feast day at our parish.

For many years our parish has hosted the annual Memorial Mass for the United Irish Societies. We also celebrate the annual Mass for the Detroit St. Patrick's Parade. I have been very happy that our parish has become the spiritual home of the Irish in metro Detroit over the last several years!

I invite you to save the date for our annual St. Patrick's Day celebration, affectionately known as the Sharin' o' the Green, on March 17! St. Patrick's Day occurs on a Sunday in 2024 so plan to come for Mass where Archbishop Vigneron will preside and the music will bring you back to the "Old Sod." Tim and Beth Smith, owners of City Renovation, are the chair couple. We will have our annual Taste of Corktown in the Peter and Connie Cracchiolo Community Center at Most Holy Trinity Catholic Academy, just down the block from the church. Bring your children and grandchildren!

I also invite you to join us for Christmas! The Mass schedule is on page four.

MOST HOLY TRINITY AND BASILICA OF STE. ANNE PREPARE TO LAUNCH HOUSE MINISTRY PROGRAM

The sister parishes of the Basilica of Ste. Anne de Detroit and Most Holy Trinity will soon be launching a new House Ministry Program to better serve parishioners and Catholics in our community who may not attend Mass regularly.

"We are going to be meeting people where they are, and that might not be inside the walls of the church building," said Antonio Guzman-Diaz, Director of Family and Engagement, Southwest Detroit Family of Parishes, Basilica of Ste. Anne de Detroit and Most Holy Trinity Parish.

Working closely with Msgr. Chuck Kosanke and Fr. John Herman, Antonio is currently in the process of training about a dozen volunteers of varying ages to become House Ministers. Once their training is complete in January, they will start reaching out to Catholics in their neighborhoods and arrange to visit them.

"We are going to reach out to people who aren't coming to church and get to know them better and find out what their needs are. Maybe they will have material needs for meals or transportation. May they will have spiritual needs like a baby who has not been baptized, or they want to enroll a child in Religious Education but they don't know how. Maybe it's a couple living together without the Sacrament of Marriage. Maybe they need someone to bring them Communion. Whatever it is, we will be there to help them and bring them more fully into our faith community."

Volunteers undergo a six month training where they gather each week for prayer, fellowship and lessons on how to minister to their brothers and sisters in Christ. "It has been a joy to get to know the volunteers and we have gotten very close as a group. Anyone can do this as long as they have a kind heart and are willing to commit the time."
