GREETINGS FROM CORKTOWN

Dear Friends,

The atmosphere of Most Holy Trinity Catholic Academy was filled with excitement and joy as our students returned on August 26 for the first day of school. I spent the morning visiting each classroom to welcome both new and returning students. I asked about their summer. I asked if they missed us and were happy to be back. I can honestly say that the response of each class was a resounding yes. This is the sixth elementary school that I have been responsible for as a priest. I have not always heard from students that they are happy to return to school at the end of summer. (Usually, the parents are more excited!) Why this response at our school?

First, our school has a clear Catholic identity that supports a Christian environment. This environment assures stability, respect, safety, affirmation, and compassion. This becomes even more important because many of our students are being raised in unstable families who are experiencing hardships such as the death of parent, financial insecurity and serious medical issues.

Second, we have quality teachers to assure strong learning. We often take students a year or two behind grade level and bring them to grade level so that they can succeed in high school. Our graduates are accepted at some of the best high schools in metro Detroit including Cranbrook, Academy of the Sacred Heart, University of Detroit Jesuit, Cristo Rey and Cass Tech. I continue to preach that the best way out of poverty is a quality education. I also preach that we educate the whole child — head, heart and soul!

Third, our school administration provides good leadership and has an effective relationship with our parents.

I would like to share a real story, with names changed to protect the students' privacy. Juan and Antonio are brothers who come from a very unstable and chaotic home. Their dad finds it difficult to maintain employment. Mom has been in a long-term care facility for several years. They receive financial aid and our parish conference of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul has occasionally helped the family with basic needs. The boys have thrived at MHTCA and are able to put their God-given intelligence and talent to use. We have helped them to flourish under difficult family circumstances. Now, Juan is succeeding as a high school student at U of D Jesuit. Antonio is still with us at MHTCA. These two young men have bright futures because of our school.

I recognize that it is only because of the support of people like you that we can continue the incredible legacy of Most Holy Trinity. Thank you!

MHTCA Invests in School Safety and Classroom Necessities

Safety is a high priority at MHTCA. Over the past few years we have invested in school security with improved locks, cameras and coordination with the Detroit Police Department.

This year we also invested in life-saving training and equipment by acquiring an automated external defibrillator (AED) machine and training all school staff in CPR. This was done through a partnership with the Detroit Fire Department and the American Heart Association. In addition to our fire and tornado drills, the teachers have completed two cardiac emergency drills and are ready to jump into action in the event of an emergency.

Through the COVID relief funding that we received in 2022, the school was able to purchase all new desks and chairs for students as well as new whiteboards. This will allow teachers and students to have greater flexibility in classroom seating so they can more easily collaborate and engage in learning.

this holy event.




