MOST HOLY TRINITY'S 190TH CELEBRATION OF ST. PATRICK'S DAY

For the 190th time, the faithful gathered at Most Holy Trinity Church to celebrate the Feast of St. Patrick. Since the 1950's the celebration has been a fundraiser affectionately known as the Sharin' o' the Green. It supports the outreach ministries of the parish, which include a food pantry, clothing room, free legal clinic, free medial clinic, Thanksgiving and Christmas food baskets for families in need, and a Christmas party for children. Mass is always held at 12 noon, and this year the celebrant was Bishop Donald Hanchon and the homilist was Fr. Bob McCabe. Following Mass, the party begins when 250 people come together for the Taste of Corktown reception. Guests enjoy live music, craft beer, Irish whiskey and food from different restaurants including Cork & Gable, Ottava Via, Mercury Bar, McShane's, Doyle's, and Roman Village. Proceeds from the Taste of Corktown benefit Most Holy Trinity Catholic Academy, the parish's K-8 school. More than 90 percent of the students receive financial aid, and this event is very important to its success.
